





Tuition guarantee rate will continue at W&M

New financial aid OK'd; Stottleyer re-elected as rector

The College of William and Mary will continue its four-year tuition guarantee program next academic year. The board of visitors on Friday approved the budget that set the guaranteed tuition rate of \$13,978 for in-state freshmen and transfer students enrolling next fall. Their total cost to attend W&M with room, board and mandatory fees will be \$30,350 for the next academic year.

The tuition charge, which will not change over four years, was established in 2013 when the board adopted the tuition guarantee plan known as the William & Mary Promise. The plan established rates for three consecutive years for in-state students.

Rising sophomores and juniors, as well as transfers enrolling in those years, will see no increase in tuition next year.

Current in-state freshmen will continue to pay the guaranteed rate of \$12,428 next school year. Their total cost will be \$28,800 with room and board.

Current sophomores — the first to enter under the William & Mary Promise in the fall of 2013 — will pay \$10,428 per year in tuition and \$26,800 if living on campus.

In-state undergraduates who arrived before the adoption of the tuition guarantee will see a 2.4 percent increase in tuition to \$9,264, which the board said reflects the estimated rate of inflation. If living on campus, the total charges are \$25,636.

Out-of-state undergraduates will see a 2.9 percent increase in tuition in 2015-16 to \$35,122. With room and board, their total cost will be \$52,050.

The W&M board also approved more than \$1.9 million in additional need-based financial aid, which is about 18 percent of new tuition revenue, spokesman Brian Whitson said.

He said no plan is yet in place for low rates that will be set beyond 2015 under the tuition guarantee plan. Sam Jones, senior vice president of finance and administration, said the W&M Promise has been "well-received by students and their parents since it facilitates their college planning."

In other action, the board re-elected Todd A. Stottleyer, a 1985 alumnus, as rector. The board also increased rates for its junior college, Richard Bland College. Rates for full-time in-state students will go up \$217.50 per semester, bringing annual tuition and mandatory fees to \$5,493. Out-of-state students will pay \$255 more per semester for an annual total of \$15,236. ksapsdiels@timesdispatch.com (804) 649-6099

Norfolk Southern coal dust spurs worry

NORFOLK — Ever since Michael Beane moved into his home in Norfolk's historic Ghent neighborhood about 20 years ago, there's been a problem with sitting out on his second-floor porch. "It's cov- ering everything. I've been breathing it for almost 20 years," Beane said.

Beane was among concerned residents and an environmental group on Friday that called for Norfolk Southern to take steps to keep coal dust from its trains and the Lambert Point Coal Terminal from spreading into nearby neighborhoods.

On Friday, the Sierra Club presented a report it commissioned saying that dust samples from five homes have high levels of coal-like particles in them. Norfolk Southern spokesman Susan Terry said in an email that the company had not yet reviewed the report's methodology, but she said the company had taken "many voluntary dust suppression steps over the past 30 years to be environmentally responsible neighbor."
