An air permit exemption was issued in '95 for a paint booth at the locomotive shop.

COAL TRANSFER AND LOADING SYSTEM:

Today, all system components were on line to load one vessel at the pier. One of two railcar dumpers ran. Three hundred coal cars per day is the desired production

rate for one dumper. The overall control program in the yard appeared to be satifactory.

The plant appears to do well at maintaining records of all emissions data and operating parameters necesary for demonstrating compliance with permit Conditions. A copy of an O&M record for the baghouse is attached.

I observed visible emissions from a flue feed waste incinerator. I noted a smoking problem with the gas fired unit. Norfolk Southerns environmental sector had already generated written correspondence for shutting the unit down. The yard will no longer use the incinerator. I obtained a copy of the letter sent to the yard.

The registered boiler units were off line today.

Norfolk & Western reported 7.3 million tons of production in 1996. The permit was not exceeced.

This concludes todays inspection. The facility is operating with the air permit and with Air Regulations.
